At our January meeting, Jack Mullen presented an overview of the Friendship Force International World Conference, held in August 2017, in Manchester, England. Jack indicated that it was a successful conference and brought together club representatives from all over the world to share friendship and club experiences. Plenary sessions were held with focus on the following: media relations, photographing journeys, the history of FFI in sound and image, engaging your local community, and many more interesting and thoughtful topics.

Please be sure to attend the March 21st (*a Wednesday*) General Meeting at Green Man Brewery, 27 Buxton Avenue in Asheville at 5:00 p.m. (3rd Floor private room with an available elevator.) We will have a unique opportunity to spend the evening with FFI Board and Staff members from around the world. FFI Board and Staff will be in Asheville for their semi-annual Board meeting and have agreed to have dinner with us and speak with us on a one-to-one basis at this event. FFI will treat us to our first round of drinks, and food will be catered by 12 Bones. (The FFI Board and Staff want to experience Southern cuisine!) The cost of the meal is \$20.00/person. Open World, April 21 – 25, 2018 – Open World is a cultural exchange sponsored by the Legislative Branch of the US Government. Its purpose is to bring Eurasian leaders to the US to witness democracy in action on a federal, state and local level. FFWNC has participated in this program in the past; most recently in 2015, which brought Ukrainian doctors to us.

The theme we have been given for this delegation is Economic Development. Five or six delegates will spend four days with us. FFWNC will be awarded \$2,500 for sponsoring this delegation. At the time of writing this message, we have not yet learned the delegates' home country.

What we need to make this visit happen is to procure the following, as soon as possible: a Journey Coordinator (we have members who have performed as JC's before for Open World, who will be happy to offer advice), Home Hosts and Dinner Hosts. *We are told all delegates speak English, so please keep that in mind.* Please give volunteering for this important and

very worthwhile opportunity serious consideration.

The purpose of the clusters is to have photo exchanges with other FF clubs—another venue to get to know one other.
