FFWNC lunches have resumed. They occur on the opposite months of General Meetings (i.e., August, October, December, etc.)



A journey coordinator or co-coordinators are needed for both the Western Michigan outbound and the Dallas Fort Worth inbound journeys.

Become a FFWNC Journey Coordinator

Our club is recruiting members to become journey coordinators (JCs) for 2025 journeys. JCs are needed for both the inbound and outbound journeys. In October, 2024, Jan Partin and Susan Harvey will lead training for new JCs.

As noted earlier in this newsletter, our 2025 journeys will be Western Michigan outbound (Grand Rapids area) and Dallas Fort Worth inbound. In the past, two inbound or outbound JCs have occasionally been selected for journey coordination, which lightens the load for coordinators and provides the

opportunity to share input and duties. The major duties for in and outbound JCs are listed below.

Outbound JC duties

- Works with the inbound JC on journey dates and planning.
- Recruits club members to participate in the journey through newsletter efforts, email blasts and announcements at General Meetings.
- Accepts applications from potential ambassadors and passes the information on to the inbound coordinator for home host matching.
- Works with our Club Treasurer to ensure that fees to FFI (Friendship Force International) and journey expenses to the inbound club are forwarded in a timely manner.
- Presents a short, informal summary of the journey to the Club membership at a General Meeting soon after the journey ends.

Inbound JC duties

- Recruits club members to participate in the journey through newsletter efforts, email blasts and announcements at General Meetings to be home, dinner or day hosts.
- Plans the program for a visiting club's journey to our club which includes daily activities.
- Prepares a budget for the journey, which is approved by the Board. The budget details are forwarded to the inbound JC.
- Works with our Club Treasurer to arrange payment details for all outbound ambassadors' expenses.
- Ensures that arrival and departure details are in place, with home hosts assuming responsibility for airport pickups, if needed.
- Matches inbound ambassadors to our Club's home hosts.
- Advises the Board after the journey ends as to the final journey expenses and reports the journey highlights and challenges.
- Presents a short informal summary of the journey to the Club membership at a General Meeting soon after the journey ends.

As an incentive, JC(s) may accept a stipend of \$500 for international outbound journeys and \$250 for all other journeys. If there are co-JC(s), the stipend shall be shared equally. The stipend is incorporated into the budget created by the JC(s).
